Statement of Faith



SCRIPTURE

History



The rich heritage and unique mission of Kuyper College can be traced to its founding in 1939 as Reformed Bible Institute (RBI). RBI had a very clear focus to provide solid training in the Bible and preparation for ministry or service, by filling an educational niche that was neither a liberal arts college nor a seminary.

In 1970, after an extensive redesign of curriculum and programs, the Department of Education of the State of Michigan gave the College the right to confer a four-year bachelor's degree. As a result, RBI changed its name to Reformed Bible College (RBC). In 2006, as a reflection of the College's mission and vision, and in response to global needs and strategic priorities, the College restated its position and changed its name from Reformed Bible College to Kuyper College.

In 1964, RBC received institutional accreditation from the Association for Biblical Higher Education (ABHE), and in 1995 from the Higher Learning Commission (HLC). In 2003, the College was granted authority to offer a Bachelor of Social Work degree and attain accreditation for this program from the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). The College received approval to offer a Master of Ministry degree in 2017. With approval from the U.S. Department of Education in 2021, the College became a federally-recognized Work College, one of ten in the U.S. and the only such college in Michigan. These accreditation, curricular, and co-curricular developments have helped move the College toward broader ministry, vocational, and service-related professional offerings.

Whether as RBI, RBC, or Kuyper College, students come seeking an engaging Christian community and practical, high-quality academic programs to be prepared for purposeful lives of work and service. The College values a robust Bible and theology foundation, intercultural competencies, and praxis-based learning through internships and other opportunities, such as KuyperWorks, so that students can be fully prepared to live flourishing lives of ministry and service.





Philosophy of Education



Learning is rooted in love. We believe that the root of learning is love of God and neighbor, not simply the desire for good grades, achievement, or mere accumulation of knowledge. As we come to understand God's love for us, expressed most fully in Christ Jesus, we are empowered by the Holy Spirit to love and serve him in return and to love others with the same love that Jesus showed us. As people who have encountered the living God, we offer ourselves as living sacrifices to God and neighbor in clear, practical actions. To love our neighbor well means acquiring knowledge, skills, and attitudes that will allow us to communicate God's love in a variety of ways, both in words and in deeds. Thus, as students go through the programs, courses, and other learning opportunities at Kuyper College, they will be equipped with the skills needed in their chosen field of service so that they may show God's love in the spheres in which they live, work, and minister.

Learning is holistic. Many people separate academic "learning" from everyday life. Kuyper College believes that all of life involves learning. What we do in the classroom serves and strengthens students' ability to serve beyond the classroom. Similarly, we encourage students to bring their real-life experience into the class in order to enhance the learning that takes place in that environment.

This holistic approach to learning affects our view of how and where learning happens. Learning happens in a variety of co-curricular activities and events. Learning happens in chapel—in times of worship, preaching, prayer, and praise. Learning happens in formal and informal conversations among students, staff, and faculty. Learning happens as students volunteer, work, travel, go on field trips, and engage in practicums and/or internships. And learning happens in the classroom and while completing assignments--readings, exams, papers, and projects all working together to enable students to learn. This big-picture approach to learning cultivates students who are lifelong learners and therefore always open to how they can grow in their effective service to Christ's church and world.

Learning happens in community. Learning is not an individual endeavor but a communal one. The call to love God, to pursue truth, and to do justice cannot be sustained apart from a community that sees the beauty of God, delights in the truth of God, and tastes the goodness of God. Professors do not merely dispense knowledge, but have a love for their students and approach their subject matter and learning with joy. This love and joy plays a key role in helping students desire to learn and grow themselves. Further, the Kuyper community functions as an academic, social, and spiritual community, encouraging each other in the process of learning. This community oriented around worship and love of God is necessary to sustain the kind of work it takes to acquire the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to serve Christ's church and world.

The end goal of education is living faithfully for Jesus Christ in God's good world. A Kuyper College education requires students to examine and critically reflect on the world around them, so that they are ready to engage with its diverse ideas, individuals, groups, and cultures. Rooted in Scripture and a biblical, Reformed worldview, our character and life is shaped so that we can fulfill the specific callings God has given us to serve Christ's church and world.

Program Description



The Business Leadership Program

The purpose of the Business Leadership program is to integrate theology with business theory to prepare globally competent business leaders to fulfill their calling. During their time of study, students gain competencies that prepare them for a variety of organizational settings where skills in business, leadership, and organizational planning are vital. This program equips graduates to be successful within existing corporate structures and as entrepreneurs and business professionals.

The term "business leadership" is intentional as we recognize that leadership in the organizations where our graduates will serve goes beyond traditional organizational management or business administration. The curriculum satisfies all of the basic competencies of a business degree, including marketing, finance, accounting and international business, and includes the added foci of theological and biblical grounding and global awareness. Graduates from this program are qualified to pursue further graduate studies in a M.B.A. and other business-related programs.

The Business Leadership degree combines 39 credits of business courses, 21 credits of Bible and Theology, 33 credits of Arts & Sciences, along with the option of 5 minors and elective courses. Currently, it is the largest major at Kuyper and is led by one full time faculty member and nine adjunct instructors.

This program provides small class sizes, personal attention, and a Christian perspective that emphasizes social responsibility (people), environmental stewardship (planet), and financial responsibility (profit). Graduating students have been very successful in finding entry-level employment and/or going on for graduate education.







Position Description



This tenure-track Assistant Professor of Business Leadership position provides an opportunity to teach courses, network with the community, and mentor students' academic and social pursuits. The successful candidate must be a resourceful and visionary individual with an enthusiastic and contagious Christian faith who is committed to serving at an accredited Christian college where the integration of faith, student experience in best practices, and academic excellence are paramount.

The successful candidate will bring to the role a deep-seated personal faith in Jesus Christ, displaying a Christ-centered servant leadership that integrates faith and work. Critical to this is a demonstrated ability to articulate and promote a biblical, Reformed perspective in higher education. This includes a commitment to the Kuyper College Doctrinal Statement and to the Statement of Commitment for Kuyper College.

The successful candidate should also bring a distinguished record of academic and marketplace experience. Candidates whose leadership abilities and outstanding accomplishments in theory and practice could translate well to academia also are strongly encouraged to apply and will receive serious consideration.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Summary: Conducts College courses for undergraduate students and assists them in developing a professional foundation for business and leadership, being instructed in the basic values and skills required for the profession as well as an understanding of the integration of faith and business by performing the following duties:

- Teaches courses within a defined curriculum while teaching from a biblical Reformed worldview and the concepts of the triple bottom line.
- Teaches in a way that stimulates class interaction while thinking critically and creatively about the issues needed to function in the marketplace.
- Provides experiential learning opportunities for classes as appropriate, including field trips, guest speakers, and interaction with community leaders.
- Creates and grades all assignments, projects, tests, and quizzes.
- Works closely with the Business Leadership Program Director in evaluating and improving the Business Leadership Program.
- Serves as an advisor to an assigned group of students.
- Attends chapel regularly and other Kuyper College functions.
- Serves on faculty committees and other official College gatherings.
- Actively attends and serves a local church community.

- Assists students in developing a professional foundation for work practice by instructing in the basic values, knowledge, and skills of the business profession.
- Demonstrates knowledge of, experience with, and appreciation for human diversity and its impact upon the marketplace
- Contributes scholarly work to the field of business through professional presentations, service provision, and/or publishing

The Process



A committee composed of Kuyper College faculty and Business Leadership Advisory Board members is leading the search for the next Assistant Professor of Business Leadership at Kuyper College. The committee's task is to review and screen the applicants through written materials, initial interviews, recommendations and reference checks. The selected candidates will engage in a campus interview with faculty members, students, the Academic Dean, and the President. The final decision for the hire rests with the Kuyper College Board of Trustees.

- One should be from your pastor or a church leader who knows you well, attesting to your Christian faith.
